


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Putting On The Armor

- 1. Armor is Crucial
 - Provide Protection against Evil Eph. 6:13, Matt.
 6:13, John 17:15
- 3. How Does The Armor Work
 - Soldiers must complete a period of training before being issued gear and sent to the front.
 - Six pieces of armor presented by Paul in Ephesians 6:10-18
 - Belt of Truth Keep armor in place. Satin Desires to deceive us to make us doubt God. Jesus warns against deception...Matt. 24
 - Breastplate of Righteousness Protect the soldier against a divided heart. Prov.4:23. a divided heart by footholds like greed, selfishness, and idolatry.
 - Shoes of Peace Readiness. Soldiers putting on his shoes meant he was reporting to duty to invade the enemies territory bearing the Good News and reconciling humankind to God...II Cor. 5:19
 - Shield of Faith Faith in God will strengthen us in battle and enable us to resist the enemy I Peter 5:8-9; James 4:7
 - Helmet of Salvation Guard our Mind against Satan's flaming arrows I Thess. 5:8 Our renewed mind should profoundly influence our behavior.
 - Sword of The Spirit Offensive & Defensive. The better we know the Word of God, the more adept we will be at wielding this weapon to oppose the power of evil.

Putting On The Armor

- 3. Victory Assured
 - Everything to defeat the enemy provided through Christ.
 - It Remains up to use to discipline ourselves, appropriate God's provision and march into battle.

Taking Authority in The Name of Jesus Luke 10:19

Authority means "The power to rule"

God gave Adam authority to rule. Gen. 2:15-20. Satin wanted the authority God gave to man. Yet satin can only influence the children of God to the degree that man chooses to sin live in disobedience to God.

The Power of The Blood of Jesus

- The blood of Jesus means our Redemption...He fulfilled the law, the Jewish people had for generations offered animals sacrifices to atone for their sins and to satisfy the justice of God.
- Jesus was not just the sin-bearer, he was the sindestroyer.
- In order to establish the Kingdom He must himself gather the sin to himself.
- Being under the blood of Jesus does mean that any attempt of the enemy to destroy us will ultimately end in his own defeat. I Cor 2:8

The Power of the Word of God

The term "word" here [in Hebrew 4:12] is the Greek word Logos which commonly indicates the expression of a complete idea and is used in referring to the Holy Scriptures. It contrast with Rhema, which generally refers too a word spoken or given

The only piece of the spiritual warrior's armor which is both offensive and defensive is named last on Paul's list "the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God" (Eph. 6:17)

The sword is the weapon continually used by soldiers to defend themselves and to rout their enemies.

Weapon of Praise

- PRAISE, ADULATION, COMMENDATION. We heap such sentiments on people after achieving a goal or performing in some way. But keen spiritual warriors learn the power of praising God before seeing evidence of his intervention in the prayer concern. We can offer thanksgiving with such confidence because of who he is-a God of love, faithfulness, holiness, and justice.
- Scripture declares, "He is the Rock" His work are perfect, and all His ways are just. A faithful God who does no wrong, upright and just is He" (Deuteronomy 32:4) When we praise God despite negative circumstances, we affirm His power and victory over those circumstances.
- A.W. Tozer wrote, "True Christian joy is the heart's harmonious response bursts forth in praise. Three important results flow from our praise:
- 1. God receives Glory
- Our faith is increased and we are energized by the joy of our Lord that accompanies praise.
- The enemy is terrified and his plans confounded.
- Since the devil knows the power of praise, he works diligently to discourage Christians form using this potent weapon against his dark kingdom.

That's what Spiritual Warriors are to be, especially when calling upon the Lord for help.

THE POWER OF AGREEMENT

Your private prayer is important and potent, but praying with a prayer partner strengthens your effectiveness your effectiveness.

Jesus encourages partnership prayer: Matthew 18:19-20

The word "agree" in the scripture derives from the Greek word from which we get our English word "symphony" It means "to be on one accord or in harmony" or "to make one mind"

Jesus was always in agreement with his heavenly father, never doing or saying anything except what the Father instructed.

Agreement Bring Boldness-Continue

THE POWER OF AGREEMENT-Continue

Ask the Lord for the Right prayer support-be it one person or a team-who will agree in prayer with the way God has shown you to pray. Find partners who will remain steadfast and pray with you until victory is accomplished.

Here are two sample prayers of agreement from Scripture:

ANGELIC INTERVENTION

Not only are we to pray boldly and in agreement, we can count on God to send heavenly reinforcements: angels: We see several accounts in scripture:

- 2 Kings 6:17 Elisha's servants see invisible chariots protecting them.
- Psalm 34:6-7 An angel comes to aid David.
- •Psalm 91:11 God promises to "command His angels" to protect His child.
- •Daniel 6:22 An angel shuts the mouths of the lions and ¹³ deliver Daniel.

ANGELIC INTERVENTION-continues

Daniel 10:5-11 Angel brings the answer to Daniel's prayer, after encountering opposition with satanic "princes."

Other Strategies For Battle

We now turn our attention to four other effective strategies in spiritual warfare: Fasting, Weeping, laughter and shouts of joy. Experienced intercessors readily attest to the value of all four. Depending on what God wants to accomplish through us during that particular time of intercession, the Holy Spirit can guide us to when to use each specific tool.

Fasting – Abstaining form food is a physical act, but one which has spiritual significance as well. Couple with prayer, it can be a powerful spiritual warfare. Read Matthew 17:21 (See Handout)

Weeping

God promises:

- 5 Those who sow in tears
- Shall reap in joy.
- 6 He who continually goes forth weeping,
- Bearing seed for sowing,
- Shall doubtless come again with rejoicing,
- Bringing his sheaves with him. Psalm 126:5-6

Tears in scripture play a unique role in spiritual breakthrough. Here we discover that the plating of seeds accompanied by a spirit of brokenness will not only bring a spirit of rejoicing in the process. The passage, along with numerous others in scripture regarding a spirit of brokenness, pictures a variety of purpose and functions related to what might be termed "the ministry of tears" a ministry Charles H. Spurgeon defined as "liquid prayer"

Six deferent types of tears:

- 1. Tears of sorrow or suffering (2 Kings 20:5
- 2. Tears of joy (Genesis 33:4)
- 3. Tears of compassion (John 11:35)
- 4. Tears of desperation (Esther 4:1,3
- 5. Tears of travail (Isaiah 42:12, 13)
- 6. Tears of repentance (Joel 2:12, 13)

Laughter

Laughter may seem a strange warfare strategy: When we can laugh in spite of the what the enemy is trying to put upon us, we quickly put him into flight. Most of the biblical references to laughter mean "to mock, to make sport, to deride, to laugh, to scorn" a very appropriate stance toward Satin.

When a powerful king of Assyria threatened to conquer all the land of Judah, King Hezekiah prayed for deliverance and asked God to vindicate his name. The Lord responded through the prophet Isaiah with this word: "This is the word that the Lord has spoken against him [the king of Assyria]:

"The Virgin Daughter of Zion despises you and mocks you
The Daughter of Jerusalem tosses her head as you flee. Who is it you
have insulted and blasphemed? Against whom have you raised your
voice and lifted your eyes in pride? Against the holy One of Israel!" 2
Kings 19:21-22

The Holy Spirit may direct spiritual warriors to laugh in scorn at the devil's plan.

God named Abraham's son Isaac, means "laughter" Genesis 17:17 Sarah laughed Genesis 18:12, Genesis 21:6

Shouts of Joy

A shout can be anything form an acclamation of joy to a battle cry. It can be a crying noise, a crashing sound, loud clamor acry of excitement. Jesus himself will return with a shout or a word of command (Thessalonians 4:16)
